Dear St. Andrew's Family,

Last year at our Diocesan Convention, we were reminded by the keynote speaker Dean Jeffery John of "keeping the main thing, the main thing." This is not a new concept; business management experts, public administration professionals; and educators all preach the same message to their leaders.

In a sense that is the Gospel message. Jesus was all about getting his followers focused on the main thing - God's immense love for his children. Nothing - not sin, not disease, not ideology or religion, not legalism or nationalism, not even death - nothing should ever distract us from God's love. Jesus wanted everyone to know that and to respond by living out God's extravagant love in the world. "Love God with all your heart, soul, mind and strength; and love your neighbor as yourself."

At St. Andrew's our vision statement expresses our desire to live out Jesus' message - "striving to be the face of Christ within our walls and beyond our doors." And how are we the face of Christ in the world? By looking with eyes of kindness upon all of God's children and all of God's creation, especially upon the most vulnerable and marginalized. By speaking words of comfort and joy to the poor, words of welcome and forgiveness to the lost and lonely; by standing up for the oppressed, persecuted, and disparaged we proclaim God's heavenly kingdom come near. And our ministries reflect that focus - the Children's Clinic, the Preschool, support of Crossroads Mission, Santa Cruz Training Programs, Kino Border Initiative and many other organizations that serve the needs of God's beloved in our community.

Later this month, at our annual meeting, the vestry will present a balanced budget for 2017. This budget is leaner than in years past, yet it reflects an increased number of people pledging, including six new pledging families. This reflects our growing church and the changing face of our faith community - more families, more young people. In the process of creating this streamlined budget, we've had to keep

focused on “the main thing,” being the face of Christ. The two greatest resources we have are our facility and our people. So, keeping the facility open and in good repair, and keeping our people spiritually fed and growing should be the main goal of our budget. In effect the budget should reflect our best efforts at “keeping the main thing, the main thing.” And, I think you will see that it does just that. However, because it is a leaner budget, we will need to rethink how we do some of our work at St. Andrew’s. During the annual meeting we will discuss strategies for working smarter. Our church family has always given generously of its time, talent, and treasure; and I am confident that we will come up with creative and effective ways to put God’s gifts to best use.

We will get distracted from “the main thing;” it’s part of life. The troubles of the world, the cynicism and complacency of those around us, and our own fears and resentments will try to confuse and derail us. So, we need to keep reminding ourselves and each other that we are the beloved children of God. And, as long as we keep coming back to the love of God in Christ Jesus, as long as we continue to remember that loving God and loving neighbor are what it means to be Christian, then we will continue to be an unmistakable force for good in the world.



Bishop Kirk Smith visits St. Andrew's, Nogales, December 10 and 11



Thanks to everyone who helped to make our Christmas party at the December Clinic such a great success! Our patients were excited to see Santa and to receive many clothes and toys from generous donors. Pictured here is Jonathan Cordova receiving a stuffed owl from Aminah, one of the students from Sts. Peter & Paul Catholic School in Tucson. The students in 8th grade raise money each year to buy stuffed animals for the children. This year they purchased 225 owls. The class arrives in a chartered bus. They have been doing this for several years.

Jonathan lives in Hermosillo, has cerebral palsy, and is confined to a wheel chair. His parents are faithful in bringing him to the Clinic where he receives physical therapy as well as augmentative/alternative communication speech therapy. Jonathan communicates with an iPad connected with a head switch on his wheel chair because his hands are too spastic to work the keyboard. His parents work with him at home on physical therapy exercises and using the iPad.

Jonathan will turn 19 in 2017 so he is nearing the end of being able to use Clinic services. We hope what we have taught his parents will help to sustain him. Also, they continue to look for affordable services in Mexico.

In 2017, we begin our 44th year of helping children living in Mexico. 
